Presentation

This module of the Argupolis Doctoral Programme is focused upon a socio-psychological perspective of argumentative situations and on the psychological pre-requisites of an entry into an argumentative activity.

The scientific programme has been planned in order to assure an approach to different levels of analysis from the individual to the societal without forgetting those intermediate levels concerned with interpersonal relationships, conversations and hermeneutic traditions. The course will illustrate these perspectives (with no hope to be exhaustive) with the goal of introducing students to different theoretical and methodological resources.

On a practical level, this module will be organised according to various formats: *keynote talks, data session workshop, students' presentations of their doctoral work, final open discussion on open question for the further advances of the on-going work.*
